The North East Police History Society (NEPHS) held their annual exhibition at Beamish Museum over the weekend of the 2<sup>nd</sup> -3<sup>rd</sup> July. The theme of this years exhibition was 'Gentlemen at War: Policing in Britain 1939 -1945'.

The exhibition contained objects and uniforms from the North East Police History Society's own collections as well as items from the archives of Beamish Museum. The exhibition was a great success with over 1000 visitors over the weekend.

The NEPHS was formed in 1995 to preserve the history of the Police Forces the North East of England.

In 1998, the society were approached by Durham Constabulary to make an inventory of the historical documents, photographs and accoutrements with a view to making a display to be shown in Police Headquarters.

The society continues to hold exhibitions and displays and has its own journal called "Crown to Crown".
